**Looking Back on 2015:**

- The Trauma Center treated approximately 12,600 patients and had about 2,800 admissions.
- 19% of Trauma admissions were transferred from other facilities.
- 72% of Trauma patients were male and 28% were female.
- 25% of admissions were related to motor vehicle crashes, 20% were falls, 17% were penetrating injuries, 11% were motorcycle collisions, 8% were pedestrians and 19% were "Other."
